Vancouver Volcanoes Sign Two More Players

Vancouver, WA — The Vancouver Volcanoes have resigned 6'2" shooting guard Josh Jackson and signed 6'4" shooting guard, and former Central Oregon Hotshot, Clifford White. "Josh Jackson was a huge part of our 2008 title run and we are glad to have him back. He has been playing basketball and working out for 9 months straight and will come in in great shape. Cliff White is an outstanding defender and most importantly, has a great personality", said Bryan Hunter, owner of the Vancouver Volcanoes. Josh Jackson averaged 15.6 Points and 3 assists for the Volcanoes last year, and Cliff White averaged 16.3 Points, 5 rebounds, and 4.3 assists per game for the Central Oregon Hotshots.

In an unfortunate accident, 6'5" Forward Gary Muzzy, fractured his ankle in a pickup game and is expected to miss the entire 2009 season.

The first Volcanoes home game will be Saturday, April 25th versus the Seattle Mountaineers, doors open at 6pm. The Volcanoes have just come off of an impressive 18-7 record last year and are considered to be a title contender in 2009.

The Volcanoes are fifth year semi pro basketball team based out of Vancouver, Washington.
